Approval of Minutes

Daun asked the Board if there were questions or changes to the January 14, 2026, Village Board Meeting minutes or a motion to accept the minutes as distributed to Board members before-hand, posted, and placed on the website – glenbeulahwi.gov. In a motion by Schaefer and seconded by Schubert, the minutes were approved. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report

Old Business

Dam Inspection

Daun and Scott Schram have been leaving messages with the DNR and with no return call. A repair needs to be made but it would require lowering a board in the dam. If no response, the Village will make repair and put the board back in.

Recycling ordinance update per State of WI 2026-1

In a motion by Schaefer and seconded by DeTroye, ordinance 2026-1 repealing and recreating section 10.95 of the municipal code in regard to garbage, refuse and recycling requirements was approved. Motion carried

Hydrant cleaning equipment – hydrant ordinance

Daun stated the multiple uses beside hydrant cleaning a skid steer or small tractor would be used for. Currently the Village rents one from Northview Services. Daun will check to see if this rental agreement will continue if he is no longer on the board. Quotes will be gotten and will check to see if there are any grants for such equipment. Schubert checked with our Police Department about enforcing an ordinance pertaining to hydrant snow removal. One will be added in the future.

Website ADA compliance

Bertram checked with Webs by Laura, our website designer, and our site is already compliant.

MSILP project

Daun talked to the County and the Village can use the MSILP money and the ½% tax on the same project. He will reach out for help to change our project from Walnut to South Otis Street.

NEW BUSINESS:

Fire Dept/emergency Responders general business

Logs were reviewed – the fire department responded to 4 calls for January. Drills for January were radio communications and RIT with the Town of Sheboygan. The generator has been replaced on Engine 960. A pager was purchased to outfit a new member. All members completed the driving course. One member has resigned. In a motion by Schubert and seconded by DeTroye, the temporary class b license was approved for the seafood raffle 3/6-3/7. Motion carried. The EMS responded to 18 calls, one being within the Village. January training was a joint drill focusing on radio communication skills.

Cemetery

A burial request was received by someone who has relatives buried in the Walnut Grove cemetery. There is adequate space within the plot. In 2019 the board agreed not to sell any new plots, but the empty plots could be filled. Schaefer suggested that the cemetery ordinance be updated and made suggestions that only cremations be approved with flat stones. It was agreed to allow this burial request.
